To the Editor:

Do you really know what the Republican and Democrat parties stand for? Which one really is the racist party?

The GOP (Grand Old Party) was founded in 1854 as an abolitionist movement which saw slavery as a violation of the rights of man. Frederick Douglass, abolitionist, stated "I am a Republican, a black, dyed in the wool Republican, and I never intend to belong to any other party than the party of freedom and progress."

Abraham Lincoln, the first Republican president, was the author of the Emancipation Proclamation, which freed the slaves. The Republicans authored the following amendments to the Constitution: 13th (banned slavery) 14th (due process of law to blacks and all Americans) and 15th (guaranteed blacks the right to vote). For the 13th amendment ending slavery, Republicans unanimously voted for it. Yet the majority of the Democrat senators and house members voted against it. All congressional Democrats voted against the 14th amendment for due process. And for the 15th amendment all Democrats voted no to extending voting rights to blacks.

After the Civil War, the southern Democrats started the Ku Klux Klan (KKK). It is estimated that over 3,000 black Republicans and 1,000 white Republicans were lynched by the KKK between 1882 and 1968. They also imposed segregation with Jim Crow laws and fought the 1957 Civil Rights Acts sponsored by Republicans. It was filibustered in the U.S. Senate by the Democrats.

Even now we see the focus on reducing black lives in the U.S. through Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers. Margaret Sanger, who founded what is now known as the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, was a racist and eugenicist. She stated, "We don't want word to go out that we want to exterminate the negro population."
